GENERATIONAL LEADERSHIP

Purpose and Goals

1. The purpose of Generational Leadership is to see young adults meet a living God, be filled with value and ability, trained in character and then actualize their potential.
2. Our primary goals are:
 - To provide an atmosphere for young adults to deepen their relationship with the Lord.
 - To see Godly character built in the lives of young adults through discipline and leadership responsibility.
 - To impact the local community through service outreaches.

This full time training consists of academic instruction, leadership training, intensive Bible study, spiritual growth and experience in serving and ministering in a variety of avenues. GL provides a foundational year to train for full-time ministry, vocations or college.

Weekly Schedule

Generational Leadership is an eleven month program, September to July.

Monday through Thursday

8:30 - 9:30am Worship/Prayer
9:30 - 10:15am Independent Study
10:30 - 12:30pm Classroom Instruction
1:30 - 4:30pm Classroom Instruction/Outreaches

Tuesday Evenings 7:00pm - Young Adults

Wednesday Evenings 7:00pm - Leadership Training Classes

Weekly Church Services

8:30 and 10:30am - Sunday Mornings

This schedule is Monday through Thursday, with a day off on Friday. Saturday is set aside for specific areas of service, ministry or recreation. The schedule is rigorous, filled with many activities and events, both planned and spontaneous. Special conferences, vacation dates and events are subject to change. This fast paced year requires commitment and will produce tremendous individual growth.

GENERATIONAL LEADERSHIP

Entrance Qualifications

- Single and between the ages of 18 and 25
- Willing to commit full-time for eleven months
(Due to the intensity of the schedule, it is not possible to hold an outside job.)
- Have finances for tuition and monthly support
- Willing to commit to the “Guidelines for Relationships Policy”
- Acceptance to Generational Leadership is based upon application requirements, an interview process and available space.

Program Guidelines

- Any student planning to go out of town on his or her day off must notify a staff member, as well as supply contact information of where the student may be reached.
- Curfew: Sunday - Wednesday 11:00pm
Thursday - Saturday 12:00pm
- Arrive 15 minutes early to all church services and 5 minutes early to morning prayer and other meetings, unless previously announced.
- If for any reason a student is not able to attend a daily session, they must contact a staff member the night before. A significant reason will be required.
- There will be no dating during the year. Please see the “Guidelines for Relationships Policy”.
- Students are not allowed to take leave from Generational Leadership daily schedule, except for the pre-designated breaks for Thanksgiving, Christmas and Spring Break. Permission may be granted for special occasions through an appeal process.
- View G or PG movies only.
- Have a calling card to make long distance phone calls if you do not have a cell phone.
- If you bring a cell phone the following will apply:
 - cell phones are not allowed to be used during class or at GL related functions
 - arrangement for payments of cell phone plans need to be made prior to entering GL or payments need to come out of the student’s monthly support
- The following limitations apply to Internet use:
 - 30 minute time limit
 - no chat rooms
 - no browsing without a specific purpose

Entering Student Requirements

Student Fees:

- \$6,100 tuition for GL minus the \$100 non-refundable application fee, to be paid at or before Student/Parent Orientation night in the form of cash, check or money order. (Please do not bring multiple checks or money orders that have been written by sponsors, etc.)
- Minimum \$100 to a maximum \$150 per month student support money. The first payment for September support is to be paid at or before Student/Parent Orientation Night.
- \$300 set aside by student for immunization shots in the event of international travel. (This money will be required only if international travel occurs.)

Other:

- Provide a list of people who will be sponsoring the student for their monthly support money. Please include sponsors' full name, address, phone number and amount sponsored.
- A valid passport. (Valid = not to be expired within 6 months of travel date)
- A voter registration card
- A photo copy of Health Insurance Card

Personal Items: Student must have these items prior to the first day of class.

- Bible – (New American Standard is recommended for memorization.)
- Work shoes or boots
- Tennis shoes
- Work and paint clothes
- School bag or backpack
- Suitcase and carry-on bag
- Sleeping bag and pillow (Needs durable cover. No plastic garbage bags.)
- Nice blue jeans - No holes
- All-black danceable shoes
- Black belt
- Black & white socks
- Nice solid black pants (no jeans or outside pockets, ex. cargo)
- Clothes: Men – ties, dress shirts, belts, sports jacket, slacks, dress shoes, casual attire, swimsuit
Women – dresses, skirts, slacks, dress shoes, casual attire, swimsuit
(One-piece or tankini, please have board shorts to wear with your swimsuit.)
- Travel clock
- Musical instruments (if you play)

* Generational Leadership will conduct a Washington State Patrol Background Check within the first month of the program. This is for childcare purposes. (A record will not prevent a student from entering the program.)

GUIDELINES FOR RELATIONSHIPS WHILE IN GENERATIONAL LEADERSHIP

These guidelines are to protect and strengthen your relationship with the Lord. With these guidelines, it will be easier to maintain unity in the class. They are not intended to break up or keep you from Godly relationships.

- There is no dating. A date is when two people of the opposite sex arrange to be together, either alone or in a group setting.
- There will be no pairing up while in group settings. (i.e: church services, GL daily routines, banquets, rallies, youth activities, etc.)
- Affection shown to the opposite sex is expected to be the same as that shown to everyone else in the group.
- There will be no riding together alone in vehicles; someone else must accompany you. (i.e. fellow student)
- There will be no meeting at either house parent's home at any time.
- No prolonged phone conversations beyond necessary communication.

These guidelines apply to relationships with people either in or out of Generational Leadership.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION AND AGREEMENT

The cost for the eleven-month program including room, board, tuition, uniform, books and conferences is \$6,100. A NON-REFUNDABLE fee of \$100 must accompany this application. The balance must be paid in full on or before the Student/Parent Orientation night.

In addition the GL student is responsible for securing \$100-\$150 in monthly support from sponsors or personal savings, before the program begins.

The GL student will also need \$300 set aside for immunizations (if needed) in the event of international travel.

A partial refund may be granted should a student not complete the full term in Generational Leadership, using the following schedule:

- Initial two weeks 80% refunded of the total fees
- Thursday of fourth week, 70% refunded of the total fees
- Thursday of sixth week, 60% refunded of the total fees
- No refund after Friday of the sixth week
- In the event that purchases are made or expenses are incurred on behalf of a student by Generational Leadership and GL can not recoup these expenditures (i.e.: plane tickets, uniforms, conference registration, books or class materials) the student will be held responsible. If a refund is due to student, fees will first be deducted before refund is given. If after the sixth week and no refund is due, student will be required to pay these expenses in full, above and beyond tuition fees. Because GL plans for the year according to the number of students accepted into the program and cannot foresee a student's choice to depart the program, these numbers are non-negotiable.

Please sign below if you understand and agree to the paragraph above. We are asking for signatures from students and parent or guardians, even if the student is over 18 years of age, because it is vitally important that all who are involved understand and agree to these terms.
